NORA92 BRITISH CUP CHAMPIONSHIP 2026

The NORA92 British Cup will be held over 4 rounds in 2026, the championship will provide children through to adults the opportunity to participate in the official NORA Motorsport National Motocross Championship.

DATES AND VENUES

Round 1 - Landrake Motoparc - Sunday 3rd & Monday 4th May

Round 2 – FatCat Motoparc - Saturday 27th & Sunday 28th June

Round 3 – Sherwood - Saturday 1st & Sunday 2nd August

Round 4 – Gossington Motoparc - Saturday 29th & Sunday 30th August

RACE CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

Adult MX1/MX2 - scored separately (15 Years old and above)

Vets over 40 + Ladies - Open CC Machines over 40 years old and ladies scored separately

Open support - Open CC Machines (15 Years old and above)

Youth - Maximum 150cc 2 stroke or 250cc 4stroke (13 - 17 Years old)

85cc Big Wheel - Maximum 85cc 2 stroke or 150cc 4stroke (11 – 15 Years old)

85cc Small Wheel - Maximum 85cc 2 stroke or 150 4stroke (9 – 12 Years old)

65cc Junior - Maximum 65cc 2stroke or 110cc 4stroke (7 – 11 Years old)

Auto - Maximum 50cc 2 or 4 stroke, automatic – 10KW Electric (5 – 8 Years old)

Entry Fee

Entries for the NORA92 British Cup Championship are £105.00 Per Round.

**Please note entries for registered riders are prioritised until two weeks prior to the event and must be paid in full via the NORA92 website.*

Series Registration and 4 Round Entry can be paid upfront for a discounted price of £500.

Family discount is available for 3 + riders living in the same address (please contact us for more information).

Wildcard Entries

Wildcard entries (with NORA Licence) £150.00

Wildcard entries (with Day Licence) £165.00

**Wildcard entries will not be accepted until 14 days prior to the event.*

Wildcard entries will receive points and an event overall but will not be included within the overall for the Championship standings.

REFUND POLICY

Registration Fee

Registration refunds are only issued when a medical note is provided which clearly states you will be out for the championship series. Other than this, registration refund's will only be issued when a reserve rider is available to take your place. Once a rider has competed in at least 1 round of the series, the registration will not be refunded.

After round 1 of the series is complete, registration fees for all competitors are non-refundable under any circumstances.

If a race event is cancelled, we may reschedule it at our discretion. Registration refunds will only be provided if we are unable to hold more than one planned event.



Entry Fee

Entry refunds will only be issued when a medical note is provided until the **Monday before the event at 5pm**, after this date no entry refunds will be given.

Day One

Qualifying 5 Minutes Free Practice + 10 Minutes Timed Qualification

Motos 2 Full blocks of races

Day Two

Free Practice sighting lap (optional for riders competing in both days, mandatory for Sunday only riders)

Motos 2 Full blocks of races.

*If qualifying is cut short due to a Red Flag incident and there is less than 2 minutes 30 seconds remaining on the clock, an additional 2 minutes 30 seconds will be added to the qualifying session.

Weekend Overall Point Scoring

In the event of a tie, the winning results will be given to the person with the highest last race result.

Championship Point Scoring

ONLY registered riders are eligible for a championship overall.



Championship ties on points will be decided by the most race wins throughout the championship.

RACE NUMBERS

It's important that you are displaying the correct race numbers on your bike and that it's clear and visible to the timekeepers. For numbers and background colours, please refer to the NORA Motorsport Regulations, Section 6 which are available from the NORA Website.

If you do not display the correct number, you will be turned away from the hold area and will not be allowed on to the track.

TRANSPONDERS

This event will be timed using the MYLAPS timing system. Each rider will be required to have a MYLAPS transponder.

If you own a transponder and did not supply the number when entering, please make sure you let a member of staff know the number when signing on or via e-mail beforehand. Transponders can be hired, we require a driving licence, bank card or passport (held until the transponder is returned) alongside a £20 hire charge.

**Please note any transponders not returned, will be charged £360.00 for replacement.*

PRIZE MONEY AND PRIZES

MX1/MX2 - Awards for top 5 + Prize money for Top 15.

Vets, Ladies & Youth - Awards for top 5 + Prize money for Top 10.

***Adult classes will be scored separately. Prize money will be paid as separate classes.**

Auto to 85cc - Awards for all racers + Prize money for Top 10.

Open support class – Awards for top 5

TRACKSIDE ASSISTANCE

As per the NORA Motorsport regulations, we will be allowing **1 parent per rider** trackside for the Auto and 65cc Junior races **ONLY**.

All trackside assistance will be provided with a numbered high vis; these will be available from signing on. A £10 deposit is required which will be refunded on the return of the high vis vest.

Please remember that you are trackside to assist the track crew and help **ALL** riders, the purpose of you being trackside is **NOT** to coach your rider or use a mobile phone or other electronic devices. Trackside assistants deemed to be acting in the incorrect way will result in further action. We will not hesitate to red flag the race if trackside assistance gets out of control.



PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted in writing and must be presented within the 30 minutes, at the latest, of the publication of the results.

Protests must be submitted to the Clerk of the Course or Event Secretary together with the correct protest fee of £250.00. (The £250.00 fee will be submitted to NORA and donated to the Jude Morris Foundation).

RACE EVENT RULES AND PENALTIES

The use of tear offs will be prohibited at all events in 2026.

Penalties will be issues for any unsafe act and/or one that poses a direct threat on a race or the race result.

- Parent / Person / Trackside Assistant will not enter the start area prior to any rider or save / intentionally block a start gate.
 - **First Offence** – Warning will be given.
 - **Second Offence** – Rider will be disqualified from the race result.
- Preparation trackside of the start gate is strictly prohibited.
 - **First Offence** – Warning will be given.
 - **Second Offence** – Rider will receive a 5-place penalty.
- Course cutting is prohibited. If riders are forced to leave the course at any time, they must re-enter at the same point or as close as safely possible without gaining advantage.
 - **First Offence** - Competitors will receive a 5-place penalty if the above is not followed.
 - **Second Offence** – Competitors will be disqualified from the race result.
- Rider must only receive assistance in the designated pit box / mechanic area. No outside assistance is permitted on the course unless it's required to do so by an official or trackside assistance during the Auto / 65cc Junior race for fallen riders.
 - Rider will be disqualified if the above is not followed.



- Engine sizes and capacities must be in line with the correct class. Machines may be spot checked without warning.
 - Rider will receive a disqualification from the championship if deemed to be riding in the incorrect machine.
- Only 1 machine can be used per race. Once the race becomes under starters orders, machines cannot be changed. (Starters orders commence when the green flag is raised).
 - Rider will be disqualified if the above is not followed.
- If a problem occurs once the race has come under starters orders, riders must wait until the gate has dropped, at which point a mechanic may enter the start area and attempt to fix the machine.
- If a rider is not present at the start area when the 15 second board is raised, they are not eligible to join the race. (It is advised that riders are in the holding pen at least 10 minutes prior to your race.)
- Riders must observe the flag signals and act appropriately. Riders must not jump or gain an advantage during a waved yellow flag. It is the rider's responsibility to be aware of all flags and their meanings.
 - **First Offence** – Warning will be given.
 - **Second Offence** – Rider will be disqualified from the race result.
- A 15 second and 5 second board will be used; the gate will drop any time after the 5 second board is lowered.
- Riders must cross the finish line unaided, as well as complete a percentage of the race distance to receive a race finish. (50% for Youth Races – 75% for Adult Races)
 - Riders unable to complete the above will receive a DNF.
- Riders must push their bike unaided the remainder of the track to gain a race finish.
 - Riders unable to complete the above will receive a DNF.



- Riders must cross the finish line within 5 minutes of the race leader seeing the finish flag. (Subject to wet weather, this rule may not apply.)

PIT AREA AND SPECTATOR RULES

- Riding in the pits is strictly prohibited.
 - First Offence – Warning will be given.
 - Second Offence - Rider will receive a 5-place penalty in their next race.
 - Third Offence – Rider will receive a disqualification in their next race.
- No electric bikes, scooters or similar are permitted at these events.
- Dogs are to be kept on leads at all times.
- Rubbish must be taken home with you or use the skip provided.
- Strictly no tolerance on drug use.
 - Riders and any associates involved will be removed from the event and banned from the championship.
- No open fires.
- Generators must be switched off by 11pm.
- No excessive noise after 11.00pm.
- No one should access the circuit whilst machinery is in use.
